Summer Work Experience Program Begins

Job Point's partnership with the Missouri Division of Vocational Rehabilitation and area high schools, the Summer Work Experience Program (SWEP), has officially started this year. The program helps provide incoming seniors with job-related skills. For the third year, Randolph Area YMCA hired students for the six-week program, where students assisted with reception, sanitation, maintenance, landscaping, laundry and child care. C&R Market in Boonville welcomes students back for the second straight year. The Boonville students performed cashiering, bagging, stocking and food service. In addition to the day to day work, SWEP students also attend seminars on work-related skills, including networking, teamwork, communication, harassment and problem solving.

Staff have been recognized nationally for sharing their best practices, learned from years of experience, with other programs throughout the state. Malinda Gee, Data Management Coordinator, has helped the Kansas City programs with data filing and organization, while Thom Lutz, Education Instructor, has taught St. Joseph YouthBuild leaders how to administer the Test for Adult Basic Education, or TABE, to prepare students to take their High School Equivalency Test.
