Success Story

Kijon Ellis came to Job Point as a young man frustrated with his lot in life. At the suggestion of a high school counselor, he enrolled in Job Point's YouthBuild program, hoping to pass the High School Equivalency Test (HiSET), learn employment skills and get his driver's license. Kijon quickly stood out for his sense of humor and leadership qualities. At one point, Mr. Ellis started missing classes and almost gave up on his studies. With the support of staff, he pulled it together, changed his thought process and passed most of the HiSET subject tests. The

final test was math. Like many people, he struggled. After a focused month studying the subject, Kijon passed the HiSET test, earning his diploma. After accomplishing these goals, his self-confidence increased and he gained a stronger sense of self-worth. With new skills in hand, Kijon enrolled in the Job Point Summer Work Experience program at Shelter Insurance Companies. There, he maintained vehicles and kept the beautiful Shelter Gardens. Not long after, he was placed into a six-week work study program at Hampton Inn & Suites in a maintenance position. After seeing his hard work and talent at the role, Kijon was offered a full-time position and a nice pay raise. He is currently responsible for evening shift maintenance for the entire hotel. His supervisor, Anthony Sims, said, "Kijon is a hard worker. He shows up. He learns and he is dedicated." According to Kijon, one of the most important aspects of his job is communicating with his coworkers and supervisors, so that guests are satisfied and work isn't missed. "I didn't have the motivation before. But now it feels good when you have a reward at the end, when you can take care of yourself and others. That's what it all comes down to," said Mr. Ellis. For his courageous spirit, Kijon was honored at our Awards Banquet with Job Point's 2019 Award of Excellence.
