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## Success Story



**Prince "Deon" Fisher** was referred to Job Point in June by Mike Waltman of Missouri Division of Vocational Rehabilitation. He is a veteran of the United States Navy and Marine Corps, Honorably Discharged. He served in the Navy as a hospital Corpsman from 1997 to 2005, then four additional vears with the Marines as a Paralegal Specialist. Deon came to Job Point after experiencing depression, anxiety and PTSD. He also has a history of substance abuse, several legal convictions and is on parole. With three children and a recent divorce, he was working the night shift at a fast food restaurant. Nonetheless, he was determined to maintain his sobriety and mental health, and to find a better paying job. He reported a desire to obtain a position in an industrial setting. Job Point Advisor, Ranjana Hans, assisted in updating his resume, identifying appropriate job leads and completing applications. He was extremely motivated and

cooperative with staff suggestions. During a pandemic and historic unemployment rates, he was offered an Operator position at Engineered Plastic Components, and started in July. Within two days, he was promoted to Forklift Operator, including a pay raise. Deon said he is thankful for his job, his relationship with his children and the people at Job Point. "I appreciate the staff who are willing and want to help. Teamwork makes the dream work!" Job Point congratulates Deon on his outstanding personal and vocational accomplishments.

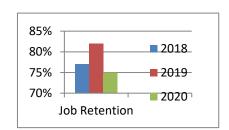
# Houses for Sale

#### 2020 Outcomes

We proudly announce our outcomes for fiscal year ending 2020. Job Point served 336 individuals. The average hourly starting wage was \$12.13, and 75% of adults entering employment maintained their job for at least 90 days. We are delighted with a 97% customer satisfaction rating.
